

PATH TO GRADUATION

Our school offers Grade 10, 11 and Grade 12 courses for students wishing to complete high school graduation.



The first step in completing your high school graduation is to find out where to begin. Our academic advisor will help with that first step by asking you to write an assessment. Our advisor will go over your previous learning and with the results of the assessment, they will recommend a path towards graduation which may include taking upgrading courses before starting grade 11 and 12 courses. They will also suggest which graduation program is best for you.

GRADUATION PROGRAMS

There are different graduation programs that lead to a graduation certificate from the BC Ministry of Education.

2018 GRADUATION PROGRAM (YOUTH)

If you entered Grade 10 or 11 in 2017/18 or later you are on the 2018 Graduation Program. To graduate, you will require 80 credits total – with a minimum of 16 at the Grade 12 level, and 28 elective course credits. 52 credits are required from the following:

- Two Career Education courses (8 credits total)
- Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)
- Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- A Language Arts 10, 11 & 12 (12 credits)
- An Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits)

ADULT GRADUATION PROGRAM

Adult learners (19 years and older) can enroll in this program if they have never completed high school graduation. In order to graduate under this program, you must complete a minimum of 20 authorized credits as follows:

Graduation requirement	Eligible courses	Credits
Language Arts 12	<u>Composition 12</u> or <u>English Studies 12</u> – or – <u>Any grade 12 English course</u>	4 credits
Mathematics 11 or 12	<u>Math 11</u> (Apprenticeship & Workplace or Foundations or Pre-Calculus) – or – <u>Math 12</u> (Apprenticeship & Workplace or Foundations or Pre-Calculus) – or – <u>Accounting 11</u>	4 credits
Elective Courses	<u>Three additional Grade 12 courses</u> authorized by the BC Ministry of Education – or – <u>Social Studies 11 and two additional Grade 12 courses</u> authorized by the BC Ministry of Education	12 credits

Adults who finished some grade 11 or 12 courses before they were 18 may count up to 2 of those completions towards their graduation credits. Some courses completed at a British Columbia College may also be used as grade 12 credit.
